## Knowledgeable Instructor Training In-Car Session Two

### What to Expect

In Session Two you will continue to be assessed on your driving skills to part two standards using MSPS(g)L routines and be given Feedback for development.

Listen to how your trainer focuses on the positives in your driving and helps you consider your areas for development. Consider how you will give feedback to your clients as an instructor and how your clients will feel when you give feedback.

You will continue looking at developing your commentary driving skills, around **alert/inform/instruct** (what/why/how) to form instruction. You will look at how to give instructions around pedestrian crossings.

### How to prepare

- Watch the video on Commentary (Alert - Inform).
- Watch the video on Rapport.
- Watch the video on Instructors' use of controls.
- Practice own driving. focus on becoming consciously aware of what your eyes/hands/feet are doing.
- Practice using MSPS(g)L (Mirrors Signal Position Speed (gear) Look) routine in your driving.
- Practice commentary driving focusing on using **Alert/Inform/Instruct** structure.
- Observe other drivers - **Eyes/Hands/Feet**.
- Continue to study Theory Test Pro towards part One.
- Read through pedestrian crossings in Practical teaching skills and driving the essential skills.
- Read through the giving instruction section of Knowledgeable Instructor Training Session Two guide and prepare 10 questions.

You get out of the course as much as you put in and spend as much time as possible between in-car sessions practising and developing your hazard management skills, theoretical knowledge, driving ability and teaching/instructor skills.

## Knowledgeable Instructor Training In-Car Session Two Giving Instruction

To instruct a pupil, you first need to be consciously aware of what you would be doing as the driver {Conscious Competence). As much as you can practice your driving in between sessions focusing on eyes/hands/feet so that you become more aware of your actions.

Once you are aware of your actions, you need to give this information in the form of clear and timely instruction. This is where commentary driving comes in. Spend as much time as you can practising commentary around Alert/Inform/Instruct.

<b>Alert</b>	<b>Inform</b>	<b>Instruct</b>
<b>What</b> the hazard is	<b>Why</b> it's a hazard	<b>How</b> you will deal with it

Begin to link your awareness of your actions {**Eyes/Hands/Feet**) to your commentary. Adding in where you are looking, what your hands are doing, and what your feet are doing {MSM routine) to your commentary.

**Alert** - There's a Zebra crossing up ahead.

**Inform** - There's an old lady walking towards it.

**Instruct** - I've checked it's safe behind, I'm easing off the accelerator and braking gently to a stop just before the line.

You will be practising all these elements in the car during session two, do as much practice as you can between sessions.

To provide a lesson to a pupil you will need to be able to structure the lesson to meet the experience, ability, and learning style of the pupil. You will discuss this in more detail in online session two. However, part of a lesson structure is to Recap already learned knowledge. Everyone has their own experiences before starting driving lessons, as a pedestrian or as a passenger in cars for example.

Consider what questions you could ask, around pedestrian crossings: -

- **Recap** prior knowledge and experience.
- **Discover** what they already know.
- **Alert** the learner to any hazards while the car is moving.

### **Come up with a list of up to TEN Questions around Pedestrian Crossings**

It will help you to firm up your knowledge of pedestrian crossings. Read through pedestrian crossings in Driving the Essential Skills and Practical Teaching Skills.

Also, look at the section about asking questions in Practical Teaching Skills. Consider reading up on the Highway Code and Theory Test Pro.
